SUBJECT: Delegation of Civilian Human Resources Authorities, Version 02-2014, effective March 31, 2014: Revision to Delegation of Civilian Human Resources Authorities Matrix and Execution, Publication and Transmission of Delegations #1 through #12, and Extension of Delegations #14 through #28

1. Reference memorandum, ASA (M&RA), SAMR, Apr 1, 2014, SAB (Encl).
2. Existing Secretary of the Army (SA) delegations of Civilian Human Resources (CHR) authorities to the ASA (M&RA) began expiring on 31 Mar 14. To ensure the continuation without interruption of expiring CHR authorities, the SA has published or extended current versions of most CHR authority delegations.
3. This memorandum delegates the CHR authorities numbers 1, 3, 4, 5, and 7 through 12, and extended CHR authority delegations 14 through 28, as listed in the enclosed matrix, to the following:
 - a. TRADOC Deputy Commanding General/Chief of Staff.
 - b. Commander, U.S. Army Combined Arms Center.
 - c. Director, Army Capabilities Integration Center.
 - d. TRADOC Deputy Commanding General, Initial Military Training.
 - e. TRADOC Deputy Chief of Staff.
 - f. Commanders, U.S. Army Centers of Excellence.
 - g. Commanders/directors of special activities who report directly to HQ TRADOC.
 - h. TRADOC Deputy Chiefs of Staff and Chiefs of Personal and Special Staff Offices.
4. Designated CHR authorities may be further delegated in writing no lower than O-6, GS-15, or equivalent level. However, consideration of financial responsibilities and processes within your command should be assessed prior to delegating these authorities below the above listed delegations.
5. Designated delegations are effective immediately and expire as stated in the accompanying matrix, unless earlier suspended, revoked, or superseded. Note that the CHR authorities matrix, Version 02-2014, has re-ordered the authorities in previous versions, so particular attention needs to be paid to this latest version. This memorandum and its accompanying matrix are not a complete compilation of delegated personnel authorities. Consult your human resources specialist regarding any other


