### Hampton Roads Virginia

The name Hampton Roads has nothing to do with the maze of interstates, highways, and roads winding throughout the region. The name highlights the area's rich colonial and maritime history.

"Roads" is a nautical term meaning calm, harborlike waters where ships can ride safely at anchor. "Hampton" refers to the third Earl of Southampton, Henry Wriothesley, who was instrumental in the successful colonization of Virginia. The region was once known as "Hampton's Roadstead."

The Mariners' Museum is one of the largest international maritime history museums filled with prized artifacts that celebrate the spirit of seafaring adventure with rare figureheads, handcrafted ship models, Civil War ironclad USS Monitor artifacts, paintings, small craft from around the world, and much more.

The Chesapeake Bay gallery's thematic exhibit areas interpret the Bay's early history, watermen, shipbuilding and military complexes, navigation, commerce, and recreation.
